Biographical Note

Louis E. Holden served as president from February 1, 1920- September 1, 1923. Holden was an honors graduate of Beloit (Wis.) College, he studied for the ministry at Princeton Theological Seminary and was ordained as a Presbyterian minister in 1891. Holden taught at Beloit College for 8 years (1891-1899), and served as fourth president of Wooster (Ohio) College for 16 years (1899-1915). Holden also served a year as secretary of the Presbyterian College Board of Church Education, and also served two years as associate secretary of the General Board prior to coming to Millikin. In late 1923, he was replaced by Dean Arthur Wald as acting president. After his time at Millikin, he returned to Beloit College as vice president. Holden died in 1942.

Scope and Content Note

This collection of papers consists mostly of correspondence between President Holden and various collegiate associations. Also present in the collection is legal paperwork pertaining to Holden's time at Wooster College and Millikin University. There is also a copy of a newspaper clipping announcing Holden's position as Millikin president. There is very little personal information on Holden within this collection. Some sensitive
